REGISTRATION

REGISTRATION DEADLINES

June 1, 2023 – Standard price (\$315) with guarantee of T-shirt (In 2019, we sold out).

June 16, 2023 – Standard price (\$315), but can't guarantee a T-shirt.

June 23, 2023 – Increased price (\$365) Chautauqua \$50 late fee imposed.

PAINTBALL & RAFTING

PAINTBALL (Restructured for 2023)

- The Paintball field is being relocated for the 2023 season.
- The new setup will be designed for more guests to have more playtime.
- The new price is \$5 per game. Payment is made at the field (cash only).
- Guests do not need to sign up in advance; simply show up at the new field.
- Safety training is still mandatory to play Paintball. This will be at the beginning of the week.
- Players will stay "in" for the whole game but will have "time-out stations" which will allow for continued play within the same game.
- Guests play on a first-come-first-play basis.
- Once a player has completed a game, they may get back in line to play another game.
- Camp will provide all the necessary equipment.

RAFTING

- Individuals must sign up in advance for this activity, done at camp. (Listen for announcements as to where and when.)
- The rafting fee is \$10 per person.
- Life vests are provided and must be worn by all participants.
- Guests must attend safety instructions prior to each trip.
- Guests launch rafts, under staff supervision, into the river at Camp Chautauqua.
- Guests must stay in the raft for the duration of the trip.
- Guests load rafts onto flatbed trailers when finished.
- Transportation back to camp is provided by Camp Chautauqua.
- Each raft must have a minimum of six participants, one leader, 21 or older, and one other adult.

STUDENT CHECKLIST

STUFF TO BRING

- A fantastic attitude and a desire to draw close to and hear from God.
- Bible, pen, notebook, etc.
- Girls bring one piece bathing suit (No cutouts and a two-piece which must be covered with a dark t-shirt).
- Warm and cool clothes for four days.

- Clothing with questionable sayings, slogans, etc.
- Clothing that promotes alcohol, cigarettes, or any other inappropriate items.
- Skateboards, scooters, rollerblade, etc.

CAMP CHAUTAUQUA

CAMP

Twice each day, we'll gather with incredible leaders and students to worship and study God's Word together.

- Quiet Hours: See Camp Schedule for quiet hours. Everyone must be respectful of other church groups.
- Cabins: Camp attempts to place each church in its own cabin, or at least within a designated area of its cabin. Depending on the number of registered guests, some churches might have to share a cabin with another group. Please maintain a low noise level, pick up after yourself, and treat other groups with respect.
- **General Behavior:** The following behaviors will not be tolerated at camp: Fighting, abuse (physical or verbal), profane/foul language, indecent exposure (please be clothed and wear shoes when outside of your cabin), smoking, theft, inappropriate photography, disruptive or unacceptable behavior.
- Late Arrivals/Early Dismissal: When a registered camper arrives late or leaves early, the camper and a leader must come to the office to complete a form for the legal transfer of responsibility. Only parents/emergency contacts/counselors can take minors off the property.
- **Visitors:** All visitors must report to the camp office, and follow all established guidelines and security measures. **Visitor dining is available (breakfast \$8.00, lunch & dinner \$10.00)** and is payable in the office. Advance notice is GREATLY appreciated.

QUESTIONS

- Will students be allowed to carry their own medicine?
 - No. Either the camp nurse or Leaders from our church will keep all medicine.
 - If there is no camp nurse, the leaders will keep the medicine in a lock box and distribute it to students as needed.
 - Please email your Youth Pastor beforehand to discuss any medications your student will need to take while at camp.
- When is the deadline to pay the remainder of my student's camp balance?
 - **June 16**. The remaining balance will automatically be taken out from the credit card you have on file 10 days prior to camp.
- Will students have their cell phones?
 - No. Leaders will keep all cell phones for the week. We want there to be as few distractions as possible, both for our students and those of other groups. If a student needs to get ahold of their parent, they can use their leader's phone.
 - If a parent wants to get ahold of their student, each leader's contact info is in the Parent Packet.
- Will students be in the same cabin as their leaders?
 - Yes.
- Does the camp provide pillows, sheets, and towels?
 - No. Students will need to bring a sleeping bag (or sheets and blankets) and a pillow.
- Do students need a nice/dressy outfit for chapel or a special event during the week?
 - No. However, students are welcome to bring a nice set of clothes if they would like.
- Can students bring a fishing pole?
 - **No**, there is no fishing at camp.
- Can students bring an instrument?
 - Yes.
